

Instructions for Music Listening

Due on Tuesday

**You will turn in your Listening Folder each Tuesday
and it will be returned to you each Thursday.**

1. Write down the name of the **piece** you listened to, **NOT** the name of the CD.
2. Write the name of the composer of the piece. This is usually found on the case of the CD.
2. Write the name of the performing group or the performer. This will usually be the name of a symphony or an orchestra or a group: for example, The New York Philharmonic, The Boston Symphony, The Empire Brass. It may also be the name of a person if this is a solo performance. If you cannot find the name of the performer on the CD case, please bring the case in for me to help you find the information. Sometimes it is written in a foreign language and may be difficult to recognize. Please do not get your listening from a source where you do not know the name of the performing group (such as: an Ipod, the computer, a copy of a CD where you do not have the CD case, or any other source where the required information is unavailable). **In other words, if you can't find the name of the performing group, the piece will not count.**
3. Write down the length of time you listened to the piece of music. Remember, you can listen to any piece of music **only twice**.
4. If you use all of the front, you may use the back. There are always extra listening sheets on the shelf in the classroom. **Please start each week's listening on a new side of a listening sheet (front side of the page).**
6. Each time you turn in your listening, you will fill in the grading form. If you listen to MORE than the required 20 minutes, put the total time in the space for that week. If you finish your 20 minutes and you want to work ahead, start a new listening page and write the extra listening on that page. Pay attention to what you are asked to listen to each week and put it on the correct page with the correct composer.
7. For listening turned in on time, you will receive 20 points per class period. If you turn in your listening up to one week late, you will get 50% credit. Listening turned in more than one week late will not count.
8. At the end of the unit there will be one "Redemption" assignment to enable you to redeem one late or missing assignment.

If your listening is incomplete or is filled out incorrectly, I will return it to you ungraded and it will count as having not been done. If it is turned in completed/corrected by the next week, I will count it as late for half credit.

Online activities will be assigned for every Thursday.

They will be posted to the website by the end of the week before so you should have a week to complete the assignments.

1. Each week there will be a variety of assignments posted on the class website or on Google classroom. Choose from among the activities and complete the activity. www.bjamusicappreciation.weebly.com.
2. Sometimes there will be an online form for you to complete. Click on the online form and complete the form --- ONE form for each piece you are required to watch. Use complete sentences, if asked for, and use well-thought-out ideas. Submit the forms by 11:00 on the night before they are due. The forms will be turned off at 11:00, so pay attention if you are a night owl.
3. Each day's work will count as 20 points. Late work will be marked down 50% the first week and a zero after that.
4. These assignments will be posted the week before they are due. It is wise for you to complete them early. You may also use the iPads before or after school in my classroom in Mrs. Litz's room whenever one of us is here. If you wait until the last minute and have computer problems, you **MUST** bring a note from your parents saying that you tried to complete the assignment but your internet was down. You will then be asked to complete the work over the lunch period or after school on the day it was due. If you are absent from school the day an online assignment is due, you will be expected to have it completed when you return to school as long as you have internet access from home or you may complete it at school the day you return.
